THE PLAZA PROJECT WELCOMES ARTISTS FOR TOMORROW EXHIBITION
*Two North Riverside Plaza Serves as Hub for Established and Up-and-Coming Artists
Participating in an Installation that will Span Downtown Chicago*

CHICAGO (March, 2015) – On May 5, The Plaza Project welcomes the Artists for Tomorrow exhibition to its outdoor venues. The installation will span an array of iconic Chicago spaces, stemming from Two North Riverside Plaza to 600 West Chicago and Illinois Center. The exhibit will celebrate a curated selection of some of Chicago’s most talented creatives across multiple artistic disciplines. A backdrop of original, commissioned pieces will set the stage for an edited mix of works ranging from performance to projection, photography to paint.

Two North Riverside Plaza will serve as home base for the city-wide initiative which will feature work from the following artists: photographer, Dietmar Busse; David Lee Csicsko, known for his work with large scale stained glass and mosaics; Chicago-based sculptor, David Green; Matthew Hoffman, known for his globally renowned *You Are Beautiful* project; and mixed-media artist David Molinaro.

The exhibit will also include the work of students from the Chicago-based non-profit, Marwen, which provides access to the art of creativity by offering free art programs to underserved youth in Chicago, among many others.

“Continuing our vision of making The Plaza Project a destination for cultural experiences, we are honored to have this group of talented artists display their work in these spaces,” said Bill Bartolotta, Plaza Project Creative Director. “Artists for Tomorrow will offer guests a moment away from their daily grind, a bit of respite from the noise of life and the hustle of downtown Chicago, and a time to simply enjoy and exist in the present.”
